The SOST invites you and your students to a **FREE** concert exploring the fascinating rhythms of dances and songs. The 45 minute program takes a story, a fairy tale, and other legends showing how music, through the vivid pictures which dance rhythms create. How does rhythm give life and motion to characters? What would songs we sing sound like without distinctive rhythms? And, how do dance movements paint a picture that words can't describe?

Your students will learn how folk songs and folk dances teach us historical stories, and how we remember images just as if we read words in a book. We'll explore these and other tales of different cultures such as Russian fairy tales, Arabian heroes and legends, and back here in Texas, how a dance about a cat paints an image that we just might find in our daily lives! The music of Copland, Tchaikovsky and others, be they ballets or berceuses will fascinate your students.
